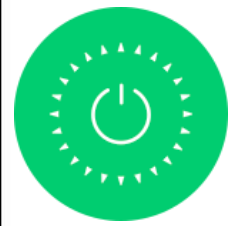

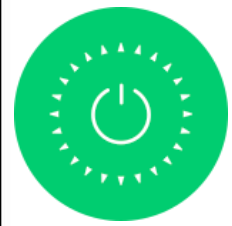

## **Possible type of actions related to energy efficiency, renewable energy sources and smart energy management**

- Implementation of pilot actions to demonstrate technical, financial, and environmental benefits of measures
- Transnational initiatives related to the technology transfer, utilization of research outcomes and adaptation to local needs and capacities
- Transnational initiatives to increase awareness, capacities and encourage active participation and inclusion of citizens, civil society organisations and private sector and cooperation with public authorities
- Integration and adaptation in regulatory frameworks, policy formulation and decision-making of provisions and performance standards

## Sectors of intervention: a horizontal approach

# Proposed Type of projects and Calls

## First Call Standard

- Open to all specific objectives
- Youth strand: special focus on projects with youth beneficiaries (lead-partners)
- 45% of programme budget

## Second Call Green transition

- Open to relevant specific objectives
- Achieving green results in a transversal approach
- Sustainable impact
- 35% of programme budget

## Third Call Capitalisation

- Open to all specific objectives
- New projects
- Valorisation of selected results from NEXT MED projects and other initiatives
- Deployment of successful solutions
- Stimulating synergies with other initiatives
- 15% of programme budget

## Forth Call Consolidation

- Open to all specific objectives
- Ongoing or closed NEXT MED projects only
- Supporting the continuation of successful projects and strengthening results
- 5% of programme budget:

# Proposal for projects: common elements

## Impact on the programme area

- at least 50% of funds to be spent in MPCs

## Budget

- EU contribution up to 90%
- co-financing 10% at least

## Partnership

- min. 3 different organizations from 3 different countries
- at least 1 organisation from MPCs
- max. 3 organisations from the same country
